In the nursing home, she would wash her under garments and put them on the heating vent. When she was chastised about doing so, she put them on a clothes line that she had hidden behind her bed.

Dresser, par excellence, Mrs. King came to church bedecked in hat, gloves, a fine suit or a beautiful dress and promenaded to her aisle seat approximately four rows from the front on the north side of the sanctuary.

Emotionally, Mrs. King was calm. She told the truth. If she didn't like something, she let you know and did not have any qualms about it. She was indeed a woman with the right attitude.

Comical as she could be, Mrs. King could have been a night club entertainer, for she was another Moms Mabley. She was so witty and



and funny and did not even know it. She was the life of any setting and would have you in stitches with laughter.

Her emotional outlook was an asset to her mental capacity. She was lucid as a centenarian and could name all of her siblings. She was very independent and looked out for herself. She loved her some money. On April 25th, her last birthday, she opened her cards and asked, "Where is the money?" Mrs. King was a card whom everyone loved.

The main attribute that kept Mrs. King going was her being a child of the King. She was born again and set apart to do God's will. She loved Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. She communicated with the Lord daily and had daily devotions with her church friends, Mrs. Leola Turnipseed and Mrs. Miriam Keathings.

As a servant of the Lord, Mrs. King worked with the Sunshine Circle and the Matron's Club. She even sang in the choir, but gave that up because it demanded too much practice.

We will miss Mrs. King, but she has left a legacy of a full and spiritual life. Her invocation to God on Sunday, May 25th was awesome and powerful. There was shouting and praising in her room. God saw His child whose body was decaying, but her inner spirit which was being renewed longed to be at rest and at peace with Him.
